For the most part, this shift was quieter than the last two days. Officers used the free time to complete reports and conduct follow-up as needed. During this shift officers investigated a theft from a retail store. Initially the suspect fled prior to TPD arrival. A few hours later he

was seen in the general area of the theft, still wearing the same clothing, on the same bike, and still had the stolen property in his possession. He was arrested and taken to jail. In another incident, an officer stopped a subject on a bicycle and found he was on probation. A probation search produced a small foil packet with powder inside it (most likely fentanyl). This subject was also arrested and taken to jail.
